

# Virtual Preschool- Day 1


<p><b>Create</b> Use markers, crayons, paint, play dough, or any other art supplies you have to make 5 green speckled frogs. You can also make a speckled log for them to sit on.</p> 	<p><b>Sing</b> Five green and speckled frogs sat on a speckled log eating the most delicious bugs Yum-Yum One jumped into the pool where it was nice and cool. Now there are 4 green speckled frogs. Keep singing until all your speckled frogs have jumped into the pool.</p>
<p><b>Play</b> Can you jump and ribbit like a frog? Can you waddle and quack like a duck? Find someone to play leapfrog with.</p>	<p><b>Relax</b> Tonight, during bath time, pretend your bath is a pond. Relax in the water like a duck or a frog sitting on a lily pad.</p>
<p><b>Help</b> Ducks and frogs both love water. Can you be a helper and fill the sink with soap and water. Ask a grown-up what dishes you can help wash. Make sure you're careful and that you get the dishes clean.</p>	<p><b>Read</b> Try reading "Little Duck named Quack" by Elis Romyana. You can find this book on Amazon for free right now.</p> 

# Virtual Preschool- Day 2

<p><b>Experiment</b> Can you grow a bean seed in a Ziploc bag? The answer is yes! Here's what you'll need: -1 Ziploc bag -1 bean seed - 1 damp paper towel -tape Take your damp paper towel and fold it in half. Put your seed inside the paper towel. Place the paper towel in the Ziploc bag. Tape your bag to a window that receives a lot of sun. Watch your bean seed as it grows. It will sprout and grow roots. You may have to add a little water to your bag as your seed grows.</p>	
<p><b>Color</b> Use a marker to color coffee filters. Then use a spray bottle to spray water on to the filters. Watch as the colors blend together. When the filters dry, glue them together to create a flower.</p>	<p><b>Garden</b> Do you have a garden at home? Help a grown-up at home by pulling all the weeds. Plant flowers in your garden and watch them grow. Don't forget to water them!</p>
<p><b>Look</b> Go outside and look for signs of spring. Do you see flowers blooming? Do you hear birds chirping? What other signs of spring do you see?</p>	<p><b>Search</b> Spring and seed both start with S! Search your house for items that start with the letter S. What did you find?</p>

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## Virtual Preschool- Day 3

<p><b>Read</b> Read "The Very Hungry Caterpillar" by Eric Carle. You can find a link on our Facebook page with Eric Carle reading his book. You can also find it for free on Amazon in a multi-book pack.</p> 	<p><b>Make</b> The very hungry caterpillar enjoyed fruits like apples, oranges, and strawberries (along with lots of other food!). With a grown-up, make a fruit salad to eat for lunch.</p> 
<p><b>Draw</b> A butterfly's wings are symmetrical. That means they are exactly the same on both sides. Color a butterfly's wings so that they are symmetrical.</p> 	<p><b>Explore</b> Go outside and go on a bug hunt. Look under rocks and leaves. Watch the grass and see what bugs you can find.</p>
<p><b>Pretend</b> Pretend to be a caterpillar. Crawl around on the floor. Make a chrysalis using a blanket. Then hatch into a beautiful butterfly and spread your wings.</p>	<p><b>Sing</b> Sing the butterfly song. Look up "If I Were a Butterfly" by Brian Howard on YouTube. Sing the songs and do the actions if you remember them.</p> 

## Virtual Preschool- Day 4

<p><b>Make</b> Glue 2 toilet paper tubes together to make binoculars. Paint or color your binoculars. Use your new binoculars to look for birds. How many birds can you see?</p> 	<p><b>Breathe</b> Go outside or open your windows. Smell the fresh spring air. Use all of your 5 senses to discover spring. What do you see? What do you hear? What do you feel? What do you smell? Close your eyes, breathe and relax.</p>
<p><b>Experiment</b> Fill plastic Easter eggs with different materials. -rice -beans -beads</p> <p>Listen to the different sounds that they make. What else can you put inside the eggs?</p>	<p><b>Create</b> Use markers or crayons to decorate paper eggs. Can you make a pattern or design on your eggs?</p> 
<p><b>Pretend</b> Use blankets or other items in your house to make a nest. Curl up in your nest and read a good book. Try "Don't Let the Pigeon Drive the Bus" by Mo Willems</p>	<p><b>Move</b> Go outside and flap your wings! Can you make an obstacle course and go through it flapping your wings like a bird?</p>

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# Virtual Preschool- Day 5

<p><b>Move</b> Say this rhyme and hop like a bunny! Bunny, bunny hopping high Bunny, bunny hopping low Bunny, bunny hopping fast Bunny, bunny hopping slow.</p> 	<p><b>Read</b> Read "Knuffle Bunny" by Mo Willems. Mo Willems is one of Mrs. Smith's favorite children's authors.  You can find "Knuffle Bunny" on Amazon for free.</p>
<p><b>Paint</b> Rabbits have fluffy tails that look like a cotton ball. Use a cotton ball to make a picture.</p>	<p><b>Create</b> Make a bunny puppet. Use a brown paper bag and draw a face on it. Use paper to create bunny ears. Use your puppet to create your own bunny story.</p>
<p><b>Help</b> Rabbits like to eat carrots and lettuce. What's your favorite veggie? Help your parent make a veggie tray for lunch and make sure to eat your vegetables!</p>	<p><b>Sing</b> Look up "Little Bunny Foo Foo with Dr. Jean" on YouTube. Sing the song with her and do the actions. </p>

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
